Language Assessment Overview

- LAC page is used to store information pertaining to any language assessment program that a student may need or is currently participating in (not LIP Codes)
- Data can be entered at school or district level
- Some information can also be added to the Student Data (STU) page



The TABLE icon at the top of the page can be used to display the table and field information for every field on the page.






• State Test (TST Table) - Testing records for determining the student's language status and needs





• **Test History (LAS Table)** - Stores hand entered information for "subsequent" tests (those taken after "initial" test) to track the progress of the student






• Other (LAF Table) - Stores hand entered records of other prior year language tests that the district would like to track







Important LAC Dates

US Entry Date

Is the date the student arrived in the United States

US Schools Age 3 & Up

- Date field to document the first entry into a US school for Title III Immigrant students and students receiving Special Education services who are at least 3 years old. The State Reporting highlighted fields may not all be required or extracted in the CALPADS files. We highlight fields that may be needed for related CALPADS reporting.
- If a preschool student is receiving Special Education services and has obtained an SSID, populate the **US School Age 3 & up** field with the date the student started preschool *and* populate the **Initial US School Enrollment Date** field with the date that the student started Transitional Kindergarten/Kindergarten. If student has not started TK or Kinder, leave **the Initial US School Enrollment Date** field blank.
- For more information see CDE: Title III Student National Origin Report (SNOR.

US School K-12 Entry

The date of a student's first enrollment in a Transitional Kindergarten through twelfth grade public or private school (including any home schooling in grades TK-12) in the United States of America and Puerto Rico. This does NOT include United States territories.

CA School

Should be populated with the date the student entered a California School

District Entry


Is populated from the District Enter date on the student form

Should be the definitive level of the student's current designation in the language program

Lang of Inst

Is the language that is used in an instructional setting for this student

Eng Class Elig


Should be how the student would handle a mainstream environment

Srvcs Rcvd

Is a choice from a state list of the services being given to the student – Note old data before LIP Codes

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Reclassification Information

- Reasonable Fluency Dt

 Is the date a student is designate to be reasonably fluent in English
- RFEP Dt (Redesignation Dt)
 The Date when the student was designated RFEP
- Code
 The code assigned to a student designated RFEP
- 30 Day 180 Day Code

 Are Codes assigned to a student after follow up
- 1 year, 2 year, 3 year, and 4 year Follow Up

Are the follow up dates from the date entered in the RFEP Date Field

1 Yr Code, 2 Yr Code, 3 YR Code, and 4 Yr Code

Are codes assigned to a student after follow up


RFEP Calculation

In the current year, the RFEP calculation is counting only valid school days until the end of the year. The calculation then skips summer days and then assumes the first day of school for next year (based on the current year calendar) and continues. Then, the 180 Day Follow-up date is based on 180 valid days form the date of a student's designation (RFEP.DT) not 180 calendar days.

Reclassification Information: When an RFEP Date is entered, the EL End Date must be the day before the RFEP Date

ELAS Code

English Language Acquisition Status Code is populated and updated from the CALPADS SELA ODS import. The processing of the SELA extract will look at these fields to determine if a student needs to be extracted.

ELAS Date

English Language Acquisition Status Date is populated and updated from the CALPADS SELA ODS import. The processing of the SELA extract will look at these fields to determine if a student needs to be extracted

LTEL

Long Term English Learner designation field

Years EL

Years as EL in a US School

IFEP Date

The date when a student was determined to be IFEP (Initial Fluent English Proficient)


ADEL Date (LAC.AES)

Adult English Learner Start Date for Adult EL students (aged 22 or older).

Home Language Survey (HLS)

- CDE contains legal requirements which direct schools to assess the English language proficiency of students
- HLS assists in determining if a student's proficiency in English should be tested
- HLS must be completed for every new student who enrolls for the first time into a California public school regardless of the language(s) that are spoken at home.
- Typical questions asked on HLS
 - Which language did your child learn when they first began to talk?
 - Which language does your child most frequently speak at home?
 - Which language do you (parents/guardians) most frequently speak with your child?
 - Which language is most spoken in the home?

Home Language Survey

Home Language Survey: First, at Home, Primary, and by Adults fields are language codes from the State provided list.

First (LAC.L1) - The student's first language, as indicated on the Home Language Survey.

At Home (LAC.L3) - The primary language spoken at the student's home, as indicated on the Home Language Survey.

Primary (LAC.L2) - The student's primary language, as indicated on the Home Language Survey.

By Adults (LAC.L4) - The primary language spoken by the adults in the home, as indicated on the Home Language Survey.

Survey Completed Date (LAC.HLD) - The date on which the Home Language Survey was completed. This can be auto-populated if a student is imported via the Online Enrollment import process and it is based on the date the Online Enrollment record was completed.

Source (LAC.SRC) - Indicates the survey completion method. An OE code will populate if the record was created via the Online Enrollment import process.

5 Language Fluency Designations

English Only (EO)

A student in TK-12 for whom the only language reported on the HLS is English or American Sign Language

To Be Determined (TBD)

A student in TK through grade 12 for whom there is a report of a primary language other than English on the HLS and for whom the district has not completed the assessment process. The assessment process must be completed within 30 days of initial enrollment.

Initial Fluent English Proficient (IFEP)

A student in TK through grade 12 for whom a language other than English is reported on the HLS and who, upon initial assessment in California using an appropriate state assessment (currently the IELPAC; prior to the 2017–18 school year, the CELDT) and from additional information when appropriate, is determined to be proficient in English.

Limited English Proficient (LEP/EL)


A student in TK through grade 12 for whom there is a report of a language other than English on the (HLS) and who, upon initial assessment in California using an appropriate state assessment (currently the English Language Proficiency Assessments for California [ELPAC] and from additional information when appropriate, is determined to lack the clearly defined English language skills of listening, speaking, reading, and/or writing necessary to succeed in the school's regular instructional programs.

Reclassified Fluent English Proficient

A student in TK through grade 12 who, upon entering public school in California, is identified as an EL and subsequently reclassified/redesignated in California, per EC 313, as proficient in English. EC 313 criteria include, but are not limited to, an assessment of English proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing as currently measured by the ELPAC, teacher evaluation of curriculum mastery, parental opinion/consultation, and student's performance of basic skills, as measured by the CAASPP-ELA that demonstrates sufficient proficiency in English to participate effectively in a curriculum designed for students of the same age whose native language is English.



Language Fluency Chart



Language Instruction Codes

Effective 2019/2020, the CDE has developed a list of Language Instruction Programs (LIPs) for English Learners. Previously, districts reported English Learner participation in English language acquisition programs by "course" and not by student. Districts will now report this data by student in the SPRG file.


Students will be required to have a Program Eligibility Start Date (PGM.ESD) and Program Eligibility End Date (PGM.EED). Since the LIP codes became effective, the Program Eligibility Start Date (PGM.ESD) needs to be after 7/1/2019. Going forward, the date can be earlier than the enrollment record as districts are not required to close out LIP program records. LIP program records remain open until the student is exited from the LIP program.

Displayed below are the new LIP Program Codes (PGM) and the Retired Instructional Strategy Codes.






