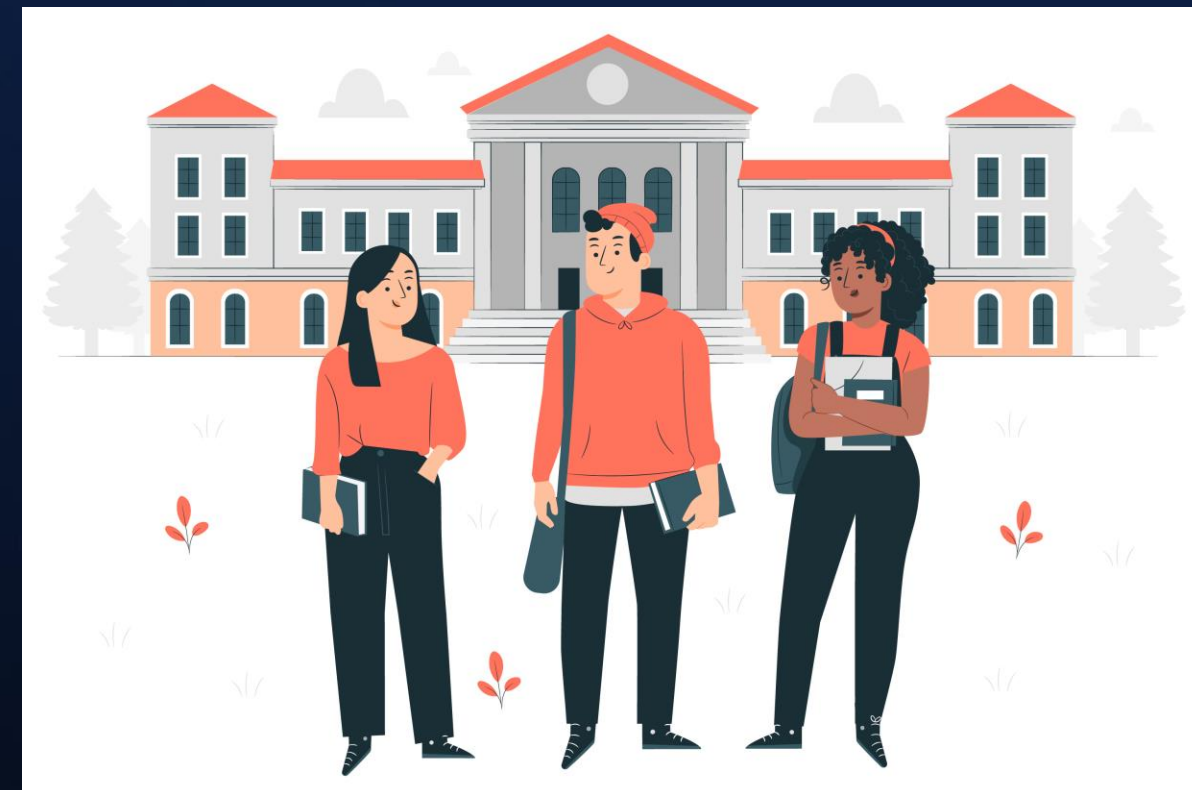

 - DASS schools: complete a CTE pathway or complete one semester/two quarters/two trimesters of a CTE course with a C- or better
 - **State and Federal Job Programs**
Complete one of the programs* and complete one semester/two quarters/two trimesters of a CTE course with a C- or better
*Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), Job Corps, YouthBuild, California Conservation Corps (CCC), and Regional Occupational Centers and Programs (ROCP)
 - **Transition Classroom and Work-Based Learning Experiences (available only to students with Individualized Education Programs [IEPs] who earn a Special Education Certificate of Completion)**
Complete at least 100 hours of work experience and the equivalent of four semester courses of college and career exploration/preparation designed to prepare a student with an IEP for employment and independent living

Approaching Prepared

Graduates classified as Approaching Prepared must meet at least one of the criteria:

- **Leadership/ Military Science**
Complete two years of Leadership/ Military Science
- **CTE Pathway**
Complete a CTE Pathway with a grade of C- or better in the capstone course
- **Non-Registered Pre-Apprenticeship**
Complete a non-registered pre-apprenticeship
- **State and Federal Job Programs**
Complete one of the programs (i.e., WIOA, Job Corp, YouthBuild, CCC, or ROCP)
- **Transition Classroom or Work-Based Learning Experiences (available only to students with IEPs who earn a Special Education Certificate of Completion).**
Complete at least 100 hours of work experience or the equivalent of four semester courses of college and career exploration/preparation designed to prepare a student with an IEP for employment and independent living

SWD status: 1 – Eligible and Participating

SWD status: 2 – Eligible and Not Participating

SWD status: 3 – Eligible, Not Enrolled

Student with Disability Status (SWDS)

When does CALPADS expect a status of 3 – Eligible, Not Enrolled?

CALPADS expects a status of 3 – Eligible, Not Enrolled when a student has exited the LEA for any of the following reasons **and they are not expected to return**. It is imperative that special education data coordinators work with their student information system (SIS) staff to determine if any of the following exits were populated in the SIS:

- Transferred out of the state (enrollment Exit Reason Code T200)
- Transferred out of the country (enrollment Exit Reason Code T240)
- Dropped out and attendance staff have conducted a comprehensive investigation as to the whereabouts of the student:
 - No known enrollment, truant (enrollment Exit Reason Code E140)
 - Expelled with no known enrollment (enrollment Exit Reason Code E300)
 - Other or unknown reason (enrollment Exit Reason Code E400)
 - Transferred to an adult education program (enrollment Exit Reason Code T260)
 - Transferred to college (enrollment Exit Reason Code T280)
 - Transferred to a program that is not primarily academic (e.g. military, job corps, justice system) (enrollment Exit Reason Codes T370 or T380)
- Died (enrollment Exit Reason Code E130)
- Completed high school with anything but a standard high school diploma:
 - Alternate Pathway Diploma (School Completion Status Code 102)
 - Certificate of Completion (School Completion Status Code 120)
 - High school equivalency certificate (School Completion Status Code 320)
 - California High School Proficiency Exam (School Completion Status Code 330)

When does CALPADS expect a status of 4 – Not Eligible?

CALPADS expects a status of 4 – Not Eligible when a student is determined to be ineligible after:

Initial evaluation; or

Re-evaluation

No Parental Consent Received to transition student from Part C (Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP)) to Part B (Individualized Education Plan (IEP))

Student Exited Special Education due to reaching the maximum age for receipt of special education services.

Student left California and Exited the Special Education Program out of State and then returned to California.



SWDS

When does CALPADS expect a status of 4 – Not Eligible?

CALPADS expects a status of 4 – Not Eligible when a student is determined to be ineligible after:

Initial evaluation; or

Re-evaluation

No Parental Consent Received to transition student from Part C (Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP)) to Part B (Individualized Education Plan (IEP))

Student Exited Special Education due to reaching the maximum age for receipt of special education services.

Student left California and Exited the Special Education Program out of State and then returned to California.



MEET

If a statutory meeting (initial evaluation, plan review, or eligibility reevaluation) is pending for a student, does the LEA have to submit a MEET record indicating the meeting is pending?

Sending MEET records for pending meetings is not required, However, for initial evaluations for Part C or Part B, it is best practice to submit a MEET record with the Pending as of Date populated once the LEA has received parental consent for evaluation. This allows SELPA staff and the Focused Monitoring and Technical Assistance (FMTA) teams to track when an initial evaluation is overdue (more than 60 days past the date of parental consent for evaluation). Once the pending meeting becomes overdue, then the MEET record should be updated to include the Meeting Delay Reason Code.

For plan reviews and eligibility reevaluations, although pending MEET records are not required, it is recommended to submit MEET records with a Pending as of Date and Meeting Delay Reason Code populated if the meetings are overdue. This is a proactive approach to inform the FMTA teams when the LEA has a valid reason for the meeting delay.

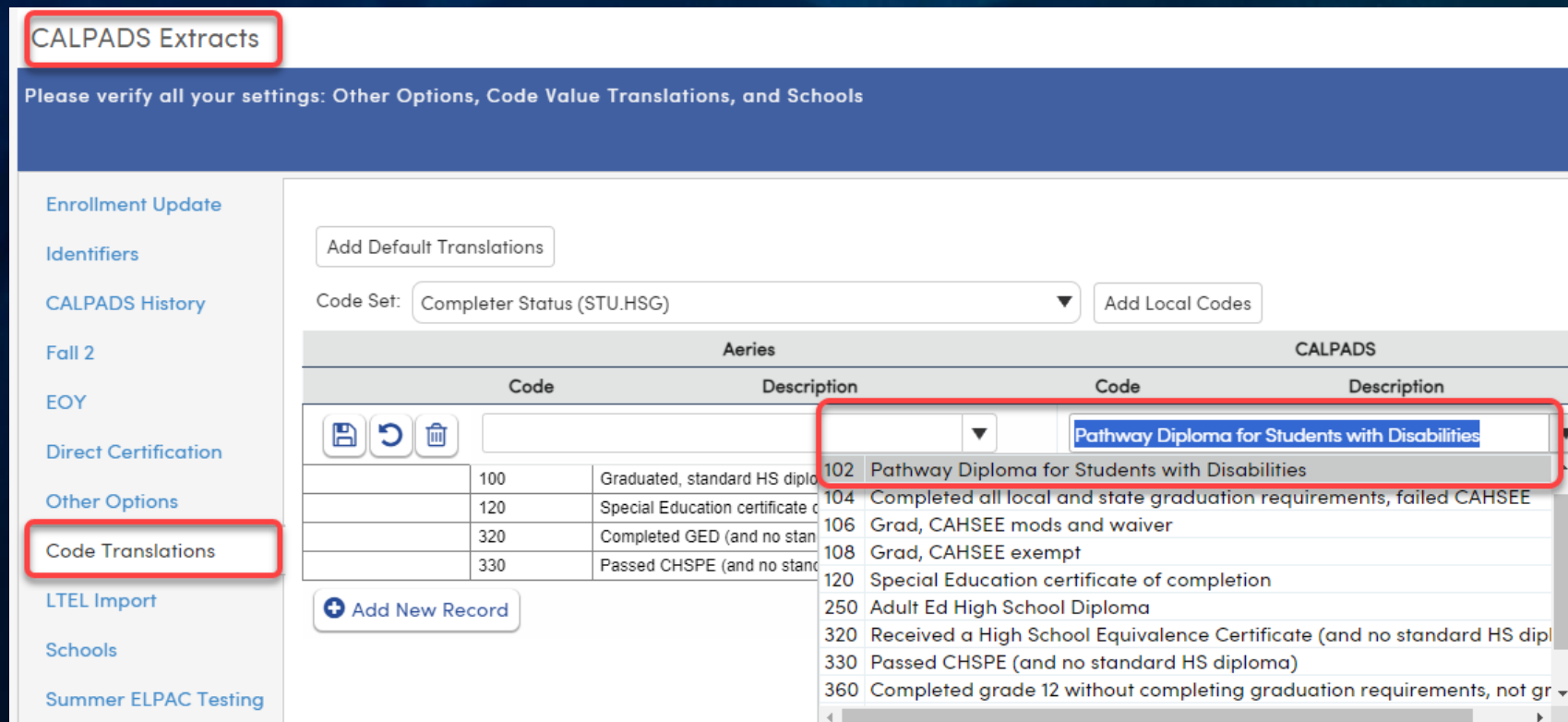

Definition: An alternate diploma given that is: (1) standards-based, and (2) aligned with the State's requirements for the regular high school diploma. This diploma is given to an eligible student with the most significant cognitive disabilities, and only if the student has taken the State's alternate assessment aligned with alternate academic achievement standards under section 1111(b)(2)(D) of the ESEA and met any other State-defined requirements.

- student who receives a high school diploma through the alternative diploma pathway eligible to continue to receive special education and related services
- the alternate diploma counts towards an LEA's graduation indicator
- *EC* Section 51225.31 went into effect on June 30, 2022; however, the law specifies that only students who entered ninth grade in the 2022–23 school year or later are eligible for this diploma

Aeries - Alternative Pathway to Diploma

LEAs will report students receiving the alternate diploma using School Completion Status code 102 – Pathway Diploma for Students with Disabilities. This code was added to the Code Translations dropdown and should be mapped to the local code.

School Completion Status Code 102 – Pathway Diploma for Students with Disabilities (effective 7/1/2023) can only be used for students meeting the following criteria:

- On an IEP
- Entered ninth grade in the 2022-23 Academic Year or later
- Eligible to take the California Alternate Assessments
- Completes state-standards aligned coursework needed to meet the state minimum graduation requirements

NOTE: The Pathway Diploma for Students with Disabilities applies to students who entered ninth grade in the 2022–23 school year or later.

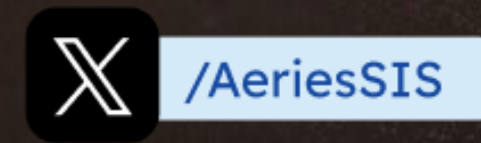
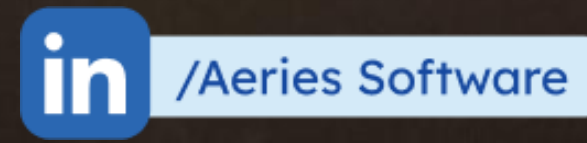
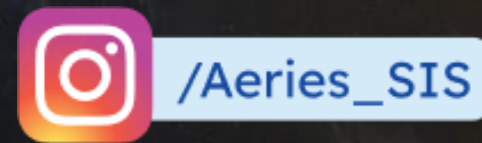
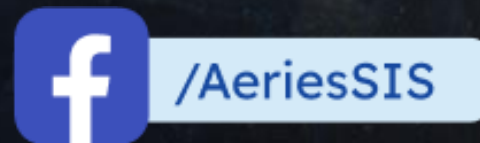
